Present Continuous Tense:

Present Continuous Tense or Present Progressive Tense

am/is/are + verb(ing)
e.g. I **am** eating my lunch.

When do we use Present Continuous Tense?

Actions that are happening now

e.g. She **is cooking** in the kitchen.

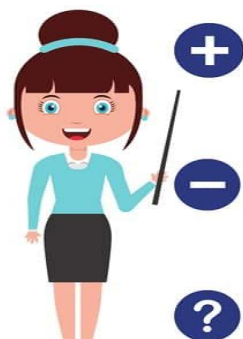
Actions that are temporary

e.g. They **are staying** in London for a few days.

Definite Future Plans

e.g. I **am going** hiking tomorrow.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS TENSE



S + am/is/are + V-ing +....

He **is** playing.

S + am/is/are (not) + V-ing +....

He **isn't** playing.

Am/is/are + S + V-ing +...?

Is he playing?

Structure of Simple Future Tense:

POSITIVE FORM			
Sbj + am/is/are + Ving			
I	+	am	+ starting
He She It	+	is	+ starting
You We You They	+	are	+ starting
+ Ex: I am crying.			

NEGATIVE FORM			
Sbj + am/is/are + NOT + Ving			
I	+	am not	+ starting
He She It	+	is not isn't	+ starting
You We You They	+	are not aren't	+ starting
- Ex: She is not (isn't) crying.			

QUESTION FORM			
Am/Is/Are + Sbj + Ving			
Am	+	I	+ starting
Is	+	He She It	+ starting
Are	+	You We You They	+ starting
